MDSC Board Members donned MDSC denim shirts once again along with our volunteers who wore neon orange vests so that they could easily be spotted for assistance when needed. We started the morning with **President Leslie Zinza** giving us a very warm welcome. Then, **Vice President Thelma Schroeder** introduced Suzanne LaFauce, LGPC, who is a Deaf Licensed Graduate Professional Counselor in the state of Maryland to present on *"Taking Charge of Your Mental Health!"* She opened her PPT slides with 3 key words: **HEAL. RECOVER. THRIVE**. Then she informed us that since May is a Mental Health Awareness Month, it is fitting that MDSC invited her to share helpful tips on how we empower ourselves to create positive charge. Enclosed in this email is the PPTs from LaFauce's presentation. We learned that The Sante Group, the agency that LaFauce works for, provides tailored services and programs F-R-E-E of charge for residents of Montgomery County who are eligible. Key takeaways from LaFauce's presentation:

- Getting therapy/counseling IS a sign of strength.
- Taking care of ourselves is vital: sleeping well, moving around, eating healthy, thinking positively, connecting with others, and being kind to yourself!
- Being proactive.
- Most importantly, a question you need to ask yourself is "What do I need?"

VP Thelma then invited several people to the stage to share updates about issues of interest to Maryland's Deaf Seniors.

**Peter Un** who serves on the Maryland Association of the Deaf board focusing on Senior Citizen issues. He informed us that the federal government distributes funds to each state to provide support to Senior Citizens. The state of Maryland allocates funds to each county. Each county spends its funds as they see fit. Montgomery County has one of the largest numbers of Deaf Senior residents. Unfortunately, services and support are not accessible to Deaf Seniors who live in the county. As we know, Deaf Seniors are scattered all over Maryland and we would like to see centralized services. DSA President **Alfred Sonnenstrahl** informed us that before joining us for the day, he attended the 11th Annual Health & Wellness Expo at Leisure World of Maryland which by the way is free and open to all in celebration of Older Americans Month in May. He stressed the importance in paying attention to discrimination that prevent us from having access to information and urged us to continue to educate the public about the needs of Deaf Senior Citizens.

After we took a break for lunch with MDSC providing cookies from Crumbl and Wegmans plus bottles of water, **Shunling and Tony Lee** shared information about a 19 day trip to Ecuador and Peru they will go this October 2022.
