

RECAP: Deaf Ecosystem with Kelby Brick Secretary Janet S. Weinstock Thursday, September 15, 2022

A total of **94** people - members, visitors, tactile interpreters, caregiver, and volunteers - gathered at the Schweinhaut Senior Center once again. **President Leslie Zinza** got on the stage to welcome everybody to the 2nd MDSC event of the year and asked the new members to stand up to be recognized.


Vice President Mike Weinstock introduced our guest speaker, Kelby N. Brick, director of the Maryland Governor's Office of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing. Kelby was a student assistant to Mike who was the head coach of the MSSD girls basketball team. Mike gave Kelby the opportunity to grow and this is exactly what Deaf Ecosystem is all about! We learned that this "Deaf Ecosystem" is not new as we used to call it "DEAF-HELP-DEAF". According to Kelby, Deaf Ecosystem in Maryland is strong *YAY*! He points to Streetcar 82 (S82) Brewing Company started by a Marylander Mark Burke and two other Deaf individuals. S82 has been practicing Deaf Ecosystem by hiring Deaf staff, buying Deaf owned products, exchanging information with other Deaf individuals, supporting other Deaf business owners, selling dog treats out of recycled grains, and welcoming Deaf customers to gather at S82 and enjoy their products. Best of all, S82 thrived during the COVID19 pandemic! He also mentioned Sisters in Style in Frederick, Crepe Crazy in Baltimore, and a center of our own - Maryland Deaf Community Center (MDCC) with hopes that there'd be other MDCC in other parts of Maryland! Kelby did all he could to make our life better as ODHH Director over the years: changing the law to give Deaf people access to mental health services and less restrictive medical implementing a statewide emergency 911 text, encouraging the use of a phone tree during the pandemic, increasing broadband so that the marginalized Deaf have access to WIFI, pushing for use of Deaf Interpreters during Maryland Governor and Mayor press conferences, giving us the opportunity to viewing Deaf Interpreters with ease on TV, using "Deaf Gain" instead of "hearing loss" to recognize that the deaf have sensory and cognitive strength, and so on...the ODHH office is named after notable and successful Deaf leaders who live in Maryland - our very own Gertrude "Gertie" Galloway and Ernest "Ernie" Hairston! Kelby shares a dream that we all have - housing for Deaf Seniors with diverse economic needs. Let's work together to make our life better for ALL Deaf Seniors of Maryland!
